With the support of the South Shore Chamber Community Development Corporation (CDC), the We the People Steering Committee was created to bring a Community Investment Vehicle (CIV) to South Shore.

We The People CIV is designed to increase local control of commercial real estate, starting with our retail corridors.

What is a CIV?

A CIV is a legal structure that allows residents to collectively pool their financial resources to buy and control neighborhood real estate assets, such as storefronts, mixed-use properties, or multi-family housing.

Local residents, business owners and nonprofits are coming together to ignite community wealth building and financial education across South Shore.

Join us at one of three info sessions to learn more about CIVs, their community impact and the potential to launch a CIV in South Shore. Community ideas and input are critical as we explore this great opportunity.

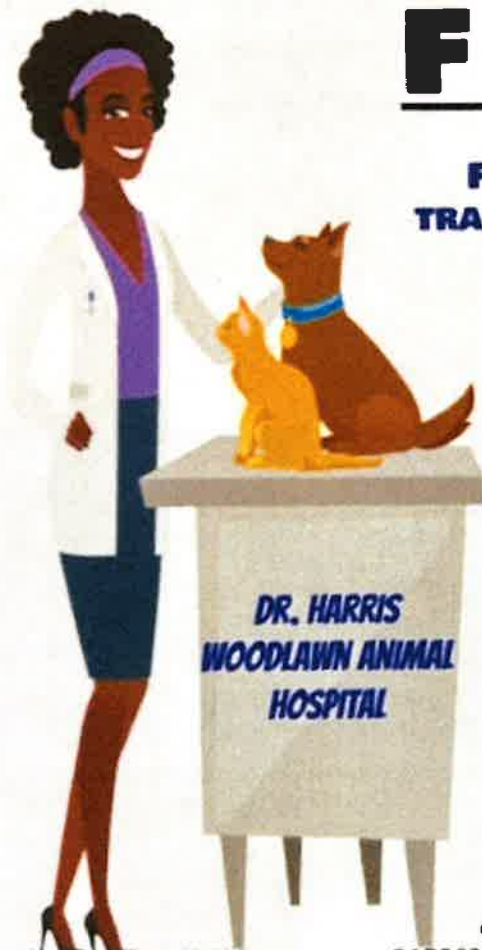

CITY OF CHICAGO CAMERA REGISTRATION

Register the Location of Your Private Camera. Help Solve Crime Faster.

The City of Chicago has launched a free and voluntary camera registration program open to anyone who lives or operates a business in Chicago. If you have a private security camera that captures the public way and you are interested in assisting in an investigation in the event of a crime in your neighborhood, you can register your camera with the Chicago Police Department. By registering your camera, you are simply allowing the Chicago Police Department to contact you in the event of a crime in your area. The Chicago Police Department will not have direct access to your camera system and cannot access camera footage without your consent. There is no requirement to provide footage at any time.

Register Your Camera



Why do some officers profile black and brown teens based off of their clothes, their hairstyles or the music they listen to?

- The Chicago Police Department does not tolerate discrimination of any kind and prohibits racial profiling and other bias-based policing.
- When performing duties, including investigatory or traffic stops and arrests, officers may not use race, ethnicity, gender, religion, disability or sexual orientation as the reason for a stop.
- An officer must be able to clearly articulate the specific police or public safety purpose of any traffic or street stop. Any observed violations can and will be reported to a supervisor.
- CPD also mandates implicit bias and constitutional policing training for all Chicago Police Officers.
- If you feel that you have been mistreated by an officer, you should file a report with the Civilian Office of Police Accountability (COPA), CPD's Bureau of Internal Affairs or any CPD supervisor. This will register the complaint and begin the investigatory process.

High Risk Intervention Teams

In May of 2022, the Community Safety Coordination Center (CSCC), in partnership with community organizations, formed High Risk Intervention Teams in an effort to conduct weekly violence reviews and identify the tasks necessary to address people and place-based issues driving violence. These teams represent a holistic and coordinated effort between the City and community partners to identify what is driving violence in each community area to identify what solutions we can quickly use to combat violence.
