

Re: Request for Emergency Authorization

Date: July 26, 2007

The Chicago Fire Department is requesting an emergency authorization for a short term interim contract for Level A Hazardous Material Suits. These suits for the fire fighters are the highest level of protection suits for fire fighters responding to a chemical, biological, or nuclear catastrophes. The Special Operations division currently has approximately 80 suits in stock, but 40 of these suits are no longer effective and need to be replaced as soon as possible. The amount of Level A suits are the bear minimum to keep our first responders protected. The usual method of procurement would be through the Technical Safety equipment contract(formally held by Hagemeyer); which expired September 30, 2006. We are working with DPS on a new contract. We anticipate award toward the end of 2007.

Attached please find three price quotations. We are recommending Environmental Safety group(ESG) because it is the lowest bid.
