



Legal Protection Fund Helps Chicago Immigrants

The Legal Protection Fund (LPF) provides free legal consultations, representation, information sessions and support for Chicago's immigrants. The Legal Protection Fund was established in January of 2017, to date, the program has provided free legal representation to Chicago residents in over 1,700 cases!

Below is a summary of the LPF work from January 2018 to September 2018:

Needed

180,000 Chicago residents are undocumented 50,000 households include an undocumented person *The immigration system does NOT provide lawyers in deportation cases.*

Effective

Over 22,500 people attended "Know Your Rights" or "DREAMer" sessions Over 1,250 legal screenings

Over 700 cases obtained free legal representation in 2018

Immigrants with lawyers are 5 times more successful in hearings
