You recently requested a statement from this office regarding the application of the Governmental Ethics Ordinance, Chapter 26.2 of the Municipal Code of Chicago, to your concurrent service as both president of the FOUNDATION R and chairman and director of the COMMISSION Q. More specifically, you requested that the Board affirm that your concurrent service in these positions would create no conflict of interest.

In response to your request, please be advised that there is no specific prohibition in the Governmental Ethics Ordinance regarding dual employment per se. Based on your representations to the Board; the general information now available to us about the Foundation, the Commission and your planned positions with each; and absent evidence that your duties as a City executive are being neglected because of your second job, your dual employment does not appear to violate the Governmental Ethics Ordinance at this time. However, the Board cannot rule out at this time the possibility that in the future, in the exercise of your duties as president of the Foundation and chair of the Commission, a conflict or other violation of the Ordinance might arise from your concurrent service.

If in the future you have any questions about specific factual situations involving your employ-
