

FIELD SERVICES



CACC responds to approximately 60,000 requests for service each year. Experienced Animal Control Officers and Inspectors patrol Chicago's neighborhoods from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. 365 days a year to protect public safety and assist injured, neglected and stray animals. CACC also investigates dog bites, potentially dangerous animals and inspects animal related businesses.



Animal Care and Control responds to emergency calls and partners with the Chicago Police Department and other law enforcement agencies to ensure dog fighters, and any other individuals who abuse or harm animals are prosecuted.



Chicago Animal Care and Control is committed to protecting public safety and ensuring the humane care of animals through sheltering, pet placement, education, and animal law enforcement.



SHELTER SERVICES



Approximately 20,000 animals visit the CACC shelter every year. As an open admission facility, CACC will never turn away an animal regardless of breed, or condition. Many animals arrive at CACC injured, ill, or very scared.

Shelter staff respond to emergency situations and perform specialized procedures to ensure that animals receive the best treatment available while at the shelter. In CACC'S care, animals are given shelter, veterinary attention, fresh food and clean water.

LOOKING FOR A PLACE TO CALL HOME!

Chicago Animal Care and Control's facility at 2741 S. Western Avenue is the place to find a lost pet, adopt the newest fluffy member of your family, rescuing an animal or volunteer to help the great animals temporarily visiting the shelter.

Lost Your Pet?

In Chicago, only four agencies are allowed to accept strays. Nearly half of the 20,000 animals taken in at CACC each year are strays. To redeem your lost pet, a valid photo ID is required to sign in at the facility and proof of animal ownership (veterinary records, purchase receipt, pictures of the pet) must be provided. Redemption fees will vary based on length of stay and other factors. Lost Pet Tours occur daily at : 12:15 pm, 1:15 pm, 2:15 pm, 4:15 pm, 5:15 pm, 6:15 pm (No Tour at 3:15) 7 days a week.

Adopt a Pet!

Every companion animal deserves a loving home. At CACC, all adoptable animals receive a health evaluation, a microchip, vaccinations and spay or neuter surgery. The shelter is open daily for adoptions from noon to 7 pm. daily.

Whether the love of your life is a pure breed or a Chicago mix, the cost to adopt is \$65. CACC is eager to help you find the perfect dog, puppy, cat or kitten for your family.



Homeward Bound Transfer Program

CACC partners with over 220 local area rescue groups as part of our homeward bound transfer programs to transition animals from our shelter into new homes. Qualified rescue groups are able to transfer animals out of our facility as soon as the animals become CACC property at no cost. The benefit of this program is that animals are able to leave the shelter more quickly



and rescue groups can often provide additional resources and specialized care where needed. In 2012, CACC transferred over 8,000 animals out of the shelter. This was a record year for the homeward bound program.
