

GOALS

Reduce the rates of STD/HIV disease among adolescents by working with youth in high morbidity areas, Chicago Public Schools, juvenile incarceration facilities, communities with large reentry populations and programs where large numbers of adolescents engaging in high-risk behaviors are located.

GUIDING PRINCIPALS

- Build on the assets and strengths of each youth for positive healthy behaviors and outcomes.
- Youth need and deserve a consistent, caring and supportive relationship with an adult.
- Provide accurate information for those adults who serve as caring supportive persons for youth.
- All program material is age and developmentally appropriate, gender specific and competent, non-judgmental, and culturally effective.
- The earlier the education and intervention occurs the more impact it will have for the individual.
