PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, throughout the course of history and even into modern times, there have existed multifaceted conflicts between nations or peoples that have inhibited and assailed the freedom and safety of countless citizens around the world; and

WHEREAS, during these trying times, many courageous individuals have made – and continue to make – the difficult decision to leave their native country for safety and opportunity; and

WHEREAS, 51.2 million individuals worldwide – including 17.9 million refugees and asylum seekers – are forcibly displaced as a result of persecution, conflict, violence, or human rights violations; and

WHEREAS, since 1980, the U.S. Refugee Act has represented the United States government's commitment to protecting refugees through resettlement and asylum programs; and

WHEREAS, diverse refugee communities have made lasting positive impacts on Chicago's cultural, spiritual and economic vitality by spurring change and transformation in many of the city's historic neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, dedicated and compassionate staff and volunteers from refugee resettlement agencies and mutual aid organizations have assisted refugees and asylum seekers in rebuilding new lives in Chicagoland for more than 40 years; and

WHEREAS, the United Nations High Commission for Refugees has recognized and commemorated June 20th as World Refugee Day since 2001; and

WHEREAS, refugee communities near and far, along with supporters and friends, will observe World Refugee Day on June 15, 2015 at Daley Plaza and June 20, 2015 at Foster Fields in Chicago with cultural celebrations and outreach activities open to the entire community:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, RAHM EMANUEL, MAYOR OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO, do hereby proclaim June 20, 2015 to be WORLD REFUGEE DAY IN CHICAGO and urge all Chicagoans to recognize the enduring contributions of refugee communities within our city and the ongoing challenges facing refugees around the globe.
