1           PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: We are going to get  
2 started. My name is Lori Lightfoot, I'm the  
3 president of the Chicago Police Board. I'm calling  
4 the meeting to order. Vice President Foreman and  
5 Board Member Eaddy are unable to attend this  
6 meeting in person and wish to attend via audio  
7 conference.

8                       Is there a motion to permit them to do  
9 that?

10           MS. DELGADO: So moved.

11           MR. O'MALLEY: Second.

12           PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: All those in favor?

13                               (Ayes in unison.)

14           PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Any opposed? The motion  
15 passes.

16                       The first item of business is approval of  
17 minutes of the Board's regular public meeting held  
18 on February 16, 2017.

19                       Is there a motion to approve the minutes?

20           MS. FRY: So moved.

21           PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Is there a second?

22           MR. SIMPSON: Second.

23           PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: All those in favor?

24                               (Ayes in unison.)



1           PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Any opposed? The motion  
2 passes.

3                   Our next regular public meeting will be  
4 on Thursday, April 20, at 7:30 p.m. here at the  
5 Chicago Public Safety Headquarters.

6           At this time I ask for a motion to close  
7 a series of executive sessions for the purpose of  
8 considering personnel matters and litigation, as  
9 authorized by Section 2(c)(1),(3),(4), and (11) of  
10 the Illinois Open Meetings Act.

11                   Is there such a motion?

12           MR. O'MALLEY: So moved.

13           PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Is there second?

14           MS. FRY: Second.

15           PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: All those in favor?

16                                   (Ayes in unison.)

17           PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Any opposed? The motion  
18 passes.

19                   A report of disciplinary action taken by  
20 the Board during the previous month has been made  
21 available at this evening's meeting. This report  
22 and the Board's written findings and decisions are  
23 posted on the Board's web site.

24                   Chris, are you here? Do you have a



1 separate script?

2 MR. SIMPSON: I don't think we can hear you  
3 down here. I'm sorry.

4 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: I'm looking for my  
5 script. One moment, please.

6 The general orders and other directives  
7 issued by the Superintendent of Police during the  
8 previous month are listed in the books made  
9 available at this evening's meeting, and posted on  
10 the Police Department's web site.

11 The next item is the Superintendent's  
12 report to the Board. The Superintendent is not  
13 with us this evening. In his stead is the First  
14 Deputy.

15 First Deputy Navarro, do you have a  
16 report or would you like to waive the oral  
17 presentation and have us receive the monthly report  
18 in writing?

19 FIRST DEPUTY NAVARRO: Waive it.

20 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Is there a motion to  
21 allow waiver of oral presentation?

22 MS. SWEENEY: So moved.

23 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Is there a second?

24 MR. SIMPSON: Second.



1 THE COURT: All those in favor?

2 (Ayes in unison.)

3 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Any opposed? The motion  
4 passes.

5 I will now call upon those members of the  
6 public who have signed up in advance to speak.  
7 When your name is called, please step up to the  
8 microphone. We ask that you limit your comments to  
9 two minutes.

10 First on the list is Mr. Henry Pettigrew.  
11 Good evening, sir.

12 MR. PETTIGREW: Good evening, Madam President,  
13 Board members. You mentioned two minutes, I  
14 thought I better do this.

15 My name is Henry Pettigrew. I'm a proud  
16 member of the Chicago Police Department, or I  
17 should say I'm a proud former member of the Chicago  
18 Police Department. In fact, I escaped, or at least  
19 I lived through the Chicago riots. Many of you  
20 were probably much younger than you are now.

21 The reason I -- my last unit of  
22 assignment was a special unit called C5s, which was  
23 attached to the Internal Affairs Division. I am  
24 here to share a suggestion, and I also have a



1 request.

2 My one suggestion is that I think about,  
3 I think about it quite a bit out of the 15 that I  
4 have, is that I was wondering, I'm hoping that we  
5 concur -- and when I say "we," I'm talking about by  
6 the Police Department, that officers who in fact  
7 are assigned or transferred to any district that is  
8 considered a high crime area, that we would -- we  
9 should in fact be certain that it's a good match or  
10 something that is not casually done.

11 The basis for why I say that and why I  
12 suggest that is that in looking back from my  
13 experience as a police officer and also in the  
14 Model Cities coordinator, I don't know if you some  
15 of you heard of Model Cities, during which I was  
16 serving as a facilitator for many groups with  
17 police officers.

18 During this time when I looked at a  
19 number of officers who in fact received their  
20 assignments as a source of stress or as a  
21 punishment. They were also a number of them who  
22 were very intimidated with the thought that they  
23 would be assigned to a troubled or a high crime  
24 area. So in many cases, they had a strong sense of



1 fear and resentment for such an assignment.

2 So my concern in sharing this is the fact  
3 that sometimes, depending on where you are working,  
4 if you have this unresolved resentment or anger,  
5 the next individual might be someone like a  
6 citizen.

7 So --

8 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Mr. Pettigrew, your time  
9 is up. Can you wrap it up?

10 MR. PETTIGREW: Yes. Pardon me. It's my  
11 request if you would in fact, I would like to  
12 volunteer if I can, if you have any room for  
13 volunteers to share in providing input and insight.  
14 Thank you.

15 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Thank you, sir.

16 MR. O'MALLEY: Thank you.

17 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Our next speaker is  
18 EvAngel YHWHnewBN.

19 MS. YHWHnewBN: Good afternoon.

20 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Good evening.

21 MS. YHWHnewBN: well, good evening. Thank you.  
22 My comments WERE really for the Superintendent.  
23 I'm glad that he's in Washington, DC, taking care  
24 of some good business, and that he was in



1 Springfield taking care of some good business also.  
2 And he's not here, so I won't make my comments  
3 regarding him.

4           However, just for the record, my name is  
5 pronounced EvAngel it's capital E, small V, capital  
6 A-n-g-e-l. And the last name is YHWHnewBN.  
7 Y-H-W-H, all capped, n-e-w, small letters, capital  
8 B and capital N. YHWHnewBN.

9           Y-H-W-H is the actually Hebrew sacred  
10 name for God. And every time you say the word,  
11 that means the most high praise. Hallelujah, you  
12 are you saying his name.

13           There is no, never was, a J in the  
14 Hebrew alphabet. So the name is -- in the book  
15 here, is continuously misspelled. And as a Hebrew  
16 spiritualite, it's very insulting when you misspell  
17 the name of God. So that's YHWH, "yah," like  
18 Hallelujah, newBN, like new creature. When the  
19 spirit comes upon you, you become a new creature.  
20 Elijah, Joshua, Joshua, all his people were called  
21 by his name.

22           So I thank you. And next week I look  
23 forward to talking -- next month I look forward to  
24 talking to the Superintendent. Thank you.





1 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Thank you, Ms. YHWHnewBN.

2 The next speaker is Queen Sister.

3 MS. SISTER: Thank you. You know, your Board  
4 that make the recommendations.

5 MS. SWEENEY: We can't hear you.

6 MS. SISTER: Can you hear me now?

7 MS. SWEENEY: Yes.

8 MS. SISTER: Mr. Foreman, can you hear me?

9 MR. FOREMAN: Yes.

10 MS. SISTER: You are a Board that makes  
11 recommendations. We question your recommendations  
12 because we can't even get answers to the questions  
13 regarding the situations of public safety that come  
14 before this Board on a monthly basis.

15 I recommend that you put all the  
16 transcripts of the public participation in these  
17 documents so that the individuals and the citizens  
18 who do not attend these meetings can be made aware  
19 of what is being addressed in its entirety in this  
20 room.

21 I also recommend that we are allowed to  
22 sign up for this meeting via email instead of  
23 playing "beat the clock" a day before. I'm  
24 appalled that the 27 page "Next Step to Reform"



1 report is not available in the Police Board  
2 meeting. It's a report issued to the public by the  
3 Superintendent of Police.

4 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Are you referring to the  
5 report that the Superintendent announced this year?

6 MS. SISTER: Yes. Because it's here on line  
7 and it's covered and, you know, and in book form.

8 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: We will make sure that  
9 that is available.

10 MS. SISTER: Thank you. And I have spoke with  
11 the Superintendent regarding a violence prevention  
12 program. He had Robin Robinson and Glen call me,  
13 and I want to say for the record I have not issued  
14 anything because I have a board. And when I went  
15 before my board, there was an issue of trust there,  
16 which you all know is a serious issue. I think  
17 it's an issue that we need to sit down and discuss.

18 And if the Superintendent is not willing  
19 to sit down with me and look me in my face, we need  
20 to look each other in the eye and resolve this  
21 issue of murder. You can cover it up and get  
22 people with crime and violence, but it is what it  
23 is. It's murder. And we have a 3-year-old shot  
24 today. And I just want to say for Robin Robinson



1 to call me, and Glen, let me just say for the  
2 individuals to be in the room that are addressing  
3 the issues and not attend this meeting is  
4 disrespectful to the people.

5 Peace and love. One village.

6 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Our next speaker is  
7 George Blakemore. Mr. Blakemore, are you here?

8 Our next speak is Kristin Noel.

9 MS. NOEL: Thank you, Madam President. Good  
10 evening, everyone.

11 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: You're here to celebrate  
12 in advance of the wild Cats?

13 MS. NOEL: That's right. We will see how far  
14 we go.

15 I wanted to address the Superintendent  
16 backing down a little bit on his use of force. So  
17 I'll just put it in this record.

18 I believe that he should stay strong with  
19 asking for de-escalation first. My issue is, is  
20 that I understand split second decisions. I think  
21 we all understand split second decisions. I think  
22 we've all been in situations where we've almost had  
23 that accident in the car, we almost did this or we  
24 almost did that, and the bottom line is we made the



1 right decision.

2 And so the split second decision should  
3 not be a decision that can be dismissed if it's  
4 wrong. So making the right split second decision  
5 is what is most important. And I think we get all  
6 caught up in split second decision, and the wrong  
7 one. Okay.

8 Betty Jones was the wrong split second  
9 decision. Rekia Boyd was the wrong is split second  
10 decision. Ronald Johnson was the wrong split  
11 second decision, okay.

12 And here is an issue I got with the  
13 Ronald Johnson case. There is a point where I  
14 think in the State's Attorney's investigation that  
15 they say that Ronald was given up and he had his  
16 hands up in the air and he was giving up. And you  
17 know what the police officer did? He put his  
18 weapon, holstered his weapon, and then he grabbed  
19 him by his head. I don't -- that -- what? why  
20 didn't he tell him to put his hands down, turn  
21 around, put his hands behind his back? why grab  
22 him by his head? And now there is a surprise that  
23 there would be a struggle. well, yeah, I'm going  
24 to struggle with you, too, if you grab me by my



1 head, you know. And he had dreads, so he probably  
2 grabbed him by his dreads. And so here's one  
3 situation where --

4 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Your time is up.

5 MS. NOEL: Okay. One situation where the split  
6 second decision was the wrong one.

7 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Thank you.

8 Mr. Blakemore, I saw that you came in the  
9 room. We called your name a few moments ago, but  
10 would you like to speak?

11 MR. BLAKEMORE: Yes. Thank you. To the  
12 citizens, I rushed over here and the cameras are  
13 gone. The crowd is gone.

14 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Mr. Blakemore, if I can  
15 ask you to speak a little more to the microphone.

16 MR. BLAKEMORE: Thank you.

17 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Thank you. That's  
18 better.

19 MR. BLAKEMORE: I came here and I was looking  
20 for the media, they had gone, the crowd. And there  
21 was just a few of the faithful are here.

22 First, I would like to thank you and the  
23 lady over in Internal Affairs. I was -- when  
24 they -- I went to the kangaroo court up on Belmont,



1 and I have a reason for calling it a kangaroo  
2 court. The officers didn't show up. However, I  
3 have to go out to this notorious Filmore Police  
4 Station and pick up my inventory. So that is very  
5 inconvenient for me.

6 I also made a complaint and I sought the  
7 investigator Black. She took the complaint, and I  
8 said I need a copy of my complaint. I went over  
9 here and they said you cannot get your complaint  
10 until your investigation is over.

11 Every citizen when he makes an oral or  
12 written complaint, he or she must sign it like an  
13 affidavit, and they must give a copy. It must be  
14 transparent to them. I want a copy of my  
15 complaint. Because what they can do, even though I  
16 signed this, they can do cut and paste. Several  
17 times I've gotten complaints back and said that's  
18 my signature, but I didn't say that. During the  
19 time I made my complaint upstairs, I was supposed  
20 to initial every sentence.

21 I want my complaint, and I want every  
22 citizen of our global city to get a written  
23 complaint, even though it's being investigated.  
24 But the complaint is their complaint. It's my



1 complaint.

2 And another thing, Police Department,  
3 please obey the law, the constitution. When you  
4 catch these illegal immigrants, you send them to  
5 ICE. You tell -- you all of you responsible for  
6 this. Black people need sanctuary. I need  
7 sanctuary.

8 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Thank you, Mr. Blakemore.

9 MR. BLAKEMORE: For all that had happen to my  
10 community, forgive me, let me break a law and I'm a  
11 black man, I have to serve my sentence.

12 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Mr. Blakemore, your time  
13 is up. Thank you.

14 MR. BLAKEMORE: But you don't. So, policeman,  
15 don't let the political system keep you from  
16 obeying the Constitution of the United States of  
17 America. He or she is not legal, make sure you  
18 arrest them and send them back from Poland, to  
19 Budapest, to Mexico, wherever they came from.

20 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Our last speaker is  
21 Robert Moore. Mr. Moore, are you here?

22 Mr. Blakemore, thank you.

23 Mr. Moore, Mr. Robert Moore, last call.

24 All right.



1           At this time all those person who signed  
2 up in advance to speak have been recognized.

3           Is there a motion to adjourn?

4           MR. SIMPSON: So moved.

5           PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Second?

6           MS. DELGADO: Second.

7           PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: All in favor?

8                           (Ayes in unison.)

9           PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Any opposed? The motion  
10 passes and the meeting is adjourned. We will see  
11 you next month.
