1           Please note our next regular public  
2 meeting will be on Monday, September 18, at  
3 7:30 p.m., here at Public Safety Headquarters.  
4 That is Monday, September 18 at 7:30 p.m. That is  
5 different than our normal schedule.

6           At this time I ask for a motion to close  
7 a series of executive sessions for the purpose of  
8 considering personnel matters and litigation, as  
9 authorized by Sections 2(c)(1),(3),(4), and (11) of  
10 the Illinois Open Meetings Act.

11           Is there such a motion?

12           MEMBER FRY: So moved.

13           MEMBER EADDY: Second.

14           PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: All those in favor?

15                           (Ayes in unison.)

16           PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Any opposed? The motion  
17 passes.

18           A report of disciplinary actions taken  
19 by the Board during the previous month has been  
20 made available at this evening's meeting. This  
21 report and the Board's written findings and  
22 decisions are posted on the Board's website.

23           The Police Board, as authorized by the  
24 Open Meetings Act, has considered in a closed



1 meeting one disciplinary case. The Board will now  
2 take final action on this case.

3           Regarding case No. 16 PD 2919, is there a  
4 motion to find that Police Officer Michael Mette  
5 not guilty of use of excessive force and making a  
6 false statement?

7           MEMBER O'MALLEY: So moved.

8           MEMBER FRY: Second.

9           PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: All in favor?

10                               (Ayes in unison.)

11           PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Any opposed?

12           MEMBER FLORES: Aye.

13           PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: So all in favor, Eaddy,  
14 Fry, O'Malley, and Sweeney. And those opposed are  
15 Lightfoot and Flores.

16           Is there a motion to adopt the written  
17 findings and decision and dissent that has been  
18 reviewed by all Board members who participated in  
19 the case?

20           MEMBER FRY: So moved.

21           MEMBER EADDY: Second.

22           PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: All in favor?

23                               (Ayes in unison.)

24           PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Any opposed?



1 All right. The motion passes.

2 The Board's decision in the case on which  
3 we took final action at this evening's meeting will  
4 be entered as of today's date, and will be issued  
5 to the parties. A copy of the written decision  
6 will be posted on the Board's website as required  
7 by the Municipal Code of Chicago.

8 The next item of business, one of the  
9 Board's hearing officers, Jacqueline walker, has  
10 decided to retire after nearly 30 years of service.  
11 First, let's thank Hearing Officer walker for her  
12 service.

13 In June the Board began a search for a  
14 new hearing officer. We received 29 applications  
15 and conducted two rounds of interviews of the top  
16 candidates.

17 Is there a motion to designate Allison  
18 wood as a hearing officer of the Police Board  
19 pursuant to Section 2-84-030 of the Municipal Code  
20 of Chicago?

21 MEMBER FRY: So moved.

22 VICE PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Second.

23 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: All in favor?

24 (Ayes in unison.)



1           PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Any opposed? The motion  
2 passes.

3           The general orders and other directives  
4 issued by the Superintendent of Police during the  
5 previous month are listed in the books made  
6 available at this evening's meeting, and are posted  
7 on the Department's website.

8           The next item is the Superintendent's  
9 report to the Board.

10           Superintendent.

11           SUPERINTENDENT JOHNSON: Just real briefly, I  
12 would just encourage members of the public,  
13 citizens of Chicago, to try to attend one of the  
14 townhall meetings that's coming up regarding the  
15 draft policy for the new community policing policy  
16 for CPD.

17           You all are the ones that is going to be  
18 most affected by that policy, and as we deal with  
19 the use of force policy, we will listen to the  
20 input, take your recommendations, and try to  
21 incorporate them into the policy. So there are  
22 meetings going on right now, but there are two more  
23 townhall meetings, and I encourage you all to  
24 attend if you can. Thank you.



1           PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Thank you,  
2           Superintendent.

3                   I will now call upon those members of the  
4           public who signed up in advance to speak. When  
5           your name is called, please step up to the  
6           microphone. And we remind you to limit your  
7           comments to two minutes so other people who signed  
8           up will have an opportunity to speak.

9                   Gwendolyn Moore. Is she here? All  
10          right.

11                  Next speaker, Samyra McDonald. Samyra  
12          McDonald.

13                  Next speaker, Stacey Liberty. Stacey  
14          Liberty.

15                  All right. Next speaker, Dorothy Holmes.  
16          Dorothy Holmes. Is Ms. Holmes here? Okay.

17                  Next speaker, Panzy Edwards.

18                  Ms. Holmes? I just called your name.  
19          Are you ready to speak, or do you need a moment?

20                  MS. HOLMES: A moment.

21                  PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Okay.

22                  Panzy Edwards.

23                  MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC: She's coming in also.

24                  PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: I'm sorry?



1 MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC: She's coming in.

2 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: William Calloway.

3 MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC: He's on his way in.

4 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Is Mr. Calloway in here?

5 Crista Noel. Is Ms. Noel here?

6 Okay. Ms. Holmes, are you ready?

7 Can you ask her to please come in,

8 because we are going to move the meeting along.

9 MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC: Did you call Gwendolyn  
10 Moore?

11 MEMBER FRY: Yes.

12 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Ms. Moore, are you here?

13 MS. MOORE: Yes.

14 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Please step up to the  
15 microphone. Good evening, Ms. Moore.

16 MS. MOORE: Good evening. My name is Gwendolyn  
17 Moore. I am the mother of Jamaal Moore that was  
18 killed by the Chicago Police 7/15/2012. I've been  
19 coming to these meetings and speaking several  
20 times, and I believe I spoke with Sharon, and then  
21 one time her assistant when she wasn't here, and  
22 I've been waiting to get some information since  
23 Jamaal's death.

24 I really believe if action had been taken



1 and investigations had been promptly executed or  
2 investigated by the authorities, I believe that we  
3 would have kind of got a handle on the police  
4 shootings. It's very hard waking up every day  
5 knowing that your son is not here, and then you see  
6 the Chicago police who is serving and protecting  
7 us -- not saying they're all bad, because they are  
8 aren't -- but I guess some bad apples are just  
9 there.

10 It's going on the fifth year that I've  
11 been trying to get some justice for Jamaal. I  
12 still have no answers. I have letters written from  
13 people saying we're investigating, with no  
14 specifics on what they are investigating. And it's  
15 very hard.

16 And since then, and in January 2016  
17 Jamaal lost his father. I lost my husband. So  
18 that's tragic for me to be without my loved ones,  
19 waking up every day without them there.

20 I stand here today and I plead to folks,  
21 Ms. Jones, the entire Board, Sharon, it's coming up  
22 on that fifth mark, and I don't want it to be a  
23 point where, oh, we tried to look into Jamaal's  
24 case. We tried to find some answers. I don't know



1 what's happened with the police officer, and that's  
2 not my case. I'm looking for justice. I'm looking  
3 for some accountability.

4 when we as citizens in the community  
5 don't uphold the law, we are held accountable. And  
6 I'm just asking that this Board does the same thing  
7 with the police officer that killed Jamaal Ramone  
8 Moore December 15, 2012.

9 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Thank you, ma'am.

10 Ms. Holmes, are you here?

11 One moment.

12 Please proceed.

13 MS. HOLMES: Good evening. I'm the mother of  
14 Ronald Johnson who was murdered October 12, 2014.  
15 And every day now it's been new evidence coming out  
16 regarding to my son's case, and one of them was  
17 that he was unarmed at the time of his death when  
18 he was gunned down by George Hernandez. And I'm  
19 still fighting.

20 It's going to be three years. I'm  
21 letting you all know I'm not going nowhere, and  
22 more and more is going to come out. And I'm also  
23 asking for a special prosecutor in his case also.  
24 And when that's done, Sharon Fairley, you just as



1 guilty as those police officers are, because that  
2 case shouldn't have been closed as quickly as it's  
3 been closed. When they came to my house and killed  
4 me dog and you said you was going to get back in  
5 touch with me about that incident, I haven't heard  
6 about that either, and it's getting ready to be two  
7 years for that also. And enough is enough.

8 I'm not going nowhere. My son ain't here  
9 to speak for his self, but he got a fighting mama,  
10 and I'm not giving up. Ain't enough money in this  
11 world going to bring me happiness, going to bring  
12 him back. For the record, I'm going to keep on  
13 fighting.

14 And, Eddie Johnson, since the last Police  
15 Board I attended, you supposed to have contacted  
16 me, and I haven't heard from you either. So you  
17 ain't no (inaudible) Rahm Emanuel either.

18 And you talk about tougher gun laws?  
19 Tell these police to stop killing our kids. Then  
20 maybe you can get trust back in our communities.  
21 Because right now you ain't got no trust in none of  
22 these communities. I got more trust in the  
23 community than you got, and you supposed to be the  
24 top person of the Police Board to get trust back in



1 these communities.

2 But no one trusting you all because of  
3 the stuff that the people that's working for you  
4 still doing. How can you hire more police officers  
5 and you still got crooked officers that still on  
6 the force? That's not going to mix. That's going  
7 to cost a whole lot of chaos. And Trump starting a  
8 war, so that's all you going to start, a war with  
9 the citizens.

10 And that's all I have to say. And I  
11 ain't going nowhere.

12 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Thank you.

13 Ms. Panzy Edwards. Ms. Panzy Edwards  
14 here?

15 Crista Noel.

16 MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC: She's here.

17 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Panzy Edwards? Okay.  
18 Come on to the microphone, ma'am.

19 MS. EDWARDS: Hello. My name is Panzy Edwards.

20 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Good evening. Can I ask  
21 you to tilt it up there. Thank you.

22 MS. EDWARDS: I'm coming to you about my son  
23 Dakota Bright. He was killed November 8, 2012.  
24 November 8 will be five years since he was killed,



1 which we got word it was unjustified. I'm the --  
2 I'm excited about that, but I still got a long road  
3 ahead of me.

4 And I just want you all to know that you  
5 all here for the police, and I'm here for my child.  
6 And all police aren't right. I know they got to be  
7 defended, but what about our kids that's being  
8 taken? They deserve some defense, too.

9 So is you all looking at my son's case?  
10 I want you all to look at it and look at it without  
11 having the police back, without having his back.  
12 But put blinders on you and look at it as a human.  
13 And look at it like right is right and wrong is  
14 wrong.

15 My son was 15 years old, shot one time in  
16 the back of his head. He didn't deserve to die,  
17 and he deserve justice. we all -- we all deserve  
18 justice, but it's tearing my up. I've been sick  
19 since this happened because the way this world is,  
20 people don't get justice. So I'm so scared that my  
21 son is not going to get the justice he deserve.

22 And I'm now just asking everyone who look  
23 at it, or everybody who come in contact with it, to  
24 just look at it. And look at the facts. Don't



1 look at it because it was a police officer and he's  
2 always right in his job. Because no human is  
3 always right.

4 So I just want everybody to look at it  
5 the right way, not through the police eyes. Thank  
6 you.

7 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Thank you.

8 will Calloway. Is Mr. Calloway here?

9 Crista Noel?

10 well, Ms. Noel, do you want to speak or  
11 not?

12 MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC: He's coming. All right.

13 MS. NOEL: Is that true, that Dakota was found  
14 was unjustified, Sharon?

15 MS. FAIRLEY: Our summary report went out  
16 tonight, yes.

17 MS. NOEL: Oh, great. Well, that is positive  
18 news. It's five years, that's not good, but we'll  
19 take it. We'll take it.

20 And I do have another question for you  
21 about Betty. Do you know when -- the report did  
22 not go up on Betty?

23 MS. FAIRLEY: Not yet.

24 MS. NOEL: I was going to check in on that.



1 Rita, this is it?

2 MEMBER FRY: It is. It's been a slice.

3 MS. NOEL: It sure is. How long has it been?

4 MEMBER FRY: Seven years.

5 MS. NOEL: Seven years, so you started when I  
6 started.

7 MEMBER FRY: Yes.

8 MS. NOEL: All right. Well, we have been in  
9 this together. I'm sorry to see you go, but you  
10 look beautiful tonight.

11 MEMBER FRY: Well, thank you.

12 MS. NOEL: I appreciate all the work that you  
13 have done. I know you have been responsible for  
14 getting rid of bad cops. I know that your legacy  
15 is one that we are always going to remember, and I  
16 just want to make sure that you know that I  
17 appreciate you.

18 And I do appreciate you all, when you all  
19 do the right thing, you know. And I do understand  
20 that you all don't have the opportunity to do the  
21 right thing as often as you'd like to do it because  
22 it's not coming from over there, and it's not  
23 coming from over there.

24 Hey, Eddie, how you doing? Me and you,



1 right?

2 SUPERINTENDENT JOHNSON: Yeah.

3 MS. NOEL: So with that being said, I'm going  
4 to let the families here that are just far more  
5 important than what I have to say. I'm an  
6 advocate, but listening to them should soften your  
7 hearts, and I hope it softens the rest of the  
8 hearts of the police officers in here.

9 I'm not going to condemn the entire  
10 police force. I have had many instances where  
11 police officers have come and, to me, have saved my  
12 life, right. There have been situations where I  
13 have hollered for help and some angel in a blue  
14 uniform has come over and helped me.

15 we locked a baby in the car one time and  
16 I was, oh, my God, and here he comes in four  
17 wheels. It's like, oh, my God. I was walking  
18 down, my car broke down on the side of the New  
19 Jersey turnpike. I put my hands up in the air, and  
20 here comes one in a car, you know.

21 So it happens. Good things happen. I'd  
22 like to celebrate that side of it as well, because  
23 I know that there are officers out there who are  
24 trying to do their best. Who honor the badge and



1 does not get honor from the badge. But the the  
2 idea is, it's important for you to recognize the  
3 ones who get honor from the badge, because those  
4 are the ones that we're complaining about, you  
5 know.

6 when you put that badge on and your chest  
7 puffs up, I've got a problem. When your chest is  
8 already puffed up and you feel good about yourself  
9 and you know what human rights is about and you  
10 have a sensitive but strong heart, and you have the  
11 presence that's necessary to get the respect  
12 because you treat people with respect, I can  
13 respect that officer. And I've met many that I  
14 have respected.

15 So but I've also met a few that are the  
16 epitome of a-s-s-h-o-l-e, okay. So those are the  
17 ones that we want gone. The ones that are shooting  
18 people and killing people, we want them gone.

19 Thank you, Sharon, for Dakota. That's  
20 been a long time in coming.

21 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Ms. Noel, if you could  
22 wrap up.

23 MS. NOEL: Yes. I'm just saying in passing.  
24 This woman has been hurting. She has not been able



1 to come up here and speak. She came up here to  
2 speak today. And I know there is a lot more work  
3 to do, but I thank you for that.

4 MS. FAIRLEY: Thank you.

5 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Our last speaker,  
6 Mr. Calloway.

7 MR. CALLOWAY: I pass.

8 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: At this time all the  
9 members who have signed up to speak in advance have  
10 been recognized.

11 Before I close, Ms. Noel said it more  
12 eloquently than I would, I want to thank Rita Fry  
13 for her service. She has served on the Police  
14 Board for the last seven years. Rita bringing with  
15 her a wealth of experience that will be hard to  
16 replicate and certainly will be missed.

17 She is a fierce defender of the rights of  
18 the people, as is her training and her nature,  
19 given her many years as an assistant public  
20 defender and, of course, the person who was the  
21 head of the office for many years.

22 She has brought a perspective to our  
23 discussion and our debate that is really important.  
24 And doing this work is not easy, and some would say



1 probably a thankless task many times.

2 But I want to say on behalf of myself  
3 personally, on behalf of the Board, and on behalf  
4 of the City, thank you so much for your service.  
5 You will be missed.

6 MEMBER FRY: You're welcome. Thank you.

7 (Applause.)

8 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Is there a motion to  
9 adjourn?

10 VICE PRESIDENT FOREMAN: So moved.

11 MEMBER EADDY: Second.

12 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: All in favor?

13 (Ayes in unison.)

14 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Thank you very much.

15 Again, our next meeting is Monday,  
16 September 18, here at Police Headquarters. Thank  
17 you.


