CLASS TITLE: DIRECTOR OF RESEARCH AND PLANNING

CHARACTERISTICS OF THE CLASS

Under general direction, directs and coordinates research and development activities for a City department; and performs related duties as required

ESSENTIAL DUTIES

- Establish work objectives/priorities
- Directs and plans operational research and generally policy studies to improve operational efficiency and/or delivery of services
- Directs and oversees departmental staff and outside consultants engaged in policy research and analysis studies, and developing new computer systems
- Directs the implementation of new policies and procedures
- Monitors the demand for departmental services and recommends operational or procedural changes to meet those needs
- Proposes new or revised policies, programs, and services based on research data
- Monitors and evaluates the effectiveness of recommended programs and policies and recommends changes to improve effectiveness
- Prepares and administers the division's annual operating budget

NOTE: *The list of essential duties is not intended to be inclusive; there may be other duties that are essential to particular positions within the class.*

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Education, Training, and Experience

- Graduation from an accredited college or university with a Bachelor's degree in the Social Sciences, Public or Business Administration or a related degree field, plus five (5) years of experience in the development and management of major planning and research studies, including two (2) years of supervisory experience; or an equivalent combination of education, training, and experience

- None

WORKING CONDITIONS

- General office environment

EQUIPMENT

- Standard office equipment (e.g., telephone, printer, photocopier, fax machine, calculator, adding machine)

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, ABILITIES, AND OTHER WORK REQUIREMENTS**Knowledge**

Comprehensive knowledge of:

- *development of comprehensive planning programs and studies
- *research practices and methodologies
- *data analysis and report preparation

Moderate knowledge of:

- *management and supervisory methods, practices, and procedures
- *applicable computer software packages and applications
- principles and practices of policy development

Knowledge of applicable City and department policies, procedures, rules, and regulations

Skills

- *ACTIVE LEARNING – Understand the implications of new information for both current and future problem-solving and decision-making
- *ACTIVE LISTENING – Give full attention to what other people are saying, taking time to understand the points being made, ask questions as appropriate, and not interrupt at inappropriate times
- *CRITICAL THINKING – Use logic and reasoning to identify the strengths and weaknesses of alternative solutions, conclusions, or approaches to problems
- *MONITORING – Monitor and assess performance of one's self, other individuals, or organizations to make improvements or take corrective action
- *MANAGEMENT OF PERSONNEL RESOURCES – Motivate, develop, and direct people as they work and identify the best people for the job
- *TIME MANAGEMENT – Manage one's own time and the time of others
- *COMPLEX PROBLEM SOLVING – Identify complex problems and review related information to develop and evaluate options and implement solutions
- *JUDGEMENT AND DECISION MAKING – Consider the relative costs and benefits of potential actions to choose the most appropriate one

Abilities

- COMPREHEND ORAL INFORMATION - Listen to and understand information and ideas presented through spoken words and sentences
- SPEAK - Communicate information and ideas in speaking so others will understand
- COMPREHEND WRITTEN INFORMATION - Read and understand information and ideas presented in writing
- WRITE - Communicate information and ideas in writing so others will understand
- RECOGNIZE PROBLEMS - Tell when something is wrong or is likely to go wrong

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- REASON TO SOLVE PROBLEMS - Apply general rules to specific problems to produce answers that make sense
- MAKE SENSE OF INFORMATION - Quickly make sense of, combine, and organize information into meaningful patterns
- REACH CONCLUSIONS - Combine pieces of information to form general rules or conclusions (includes finding a relationship among seemingly unrelated events)

Other Work Requirements

- PERSISTENCE - Persist in the face of obstacles on the job
- INITIATIVE - Demonstrate willingness to take on job challenges
- LEADERSHIP - Demonstrate willingness to lead, take charge, and offer opinions and direction
- DEPENDABILITY - Demonstrate reliability, responsibility, and dependability and fulfill obligations
- ATTENTION TO DETAIL - Pay careful attention to detail and thoroughness in completing work tasks
- INDEPENDENCE - Develop own ways of doing things, guide oneself with little or no supervision, and depend mainly on oneself to get things done
- INNOVATION - Think creatively about alternatives to come up with new ideas for and answers to work-related problems
- ANALYTICAL THINKING - Analyze information and using logic to address work or job issues and problems
