The red X program provides a visual indication that the structure to which it (they) is (are) attached has substantial deterioration or stability issues and is considered dangerous to first responders who may need to enter for fire or police service. The program was funded by a grant and targeted some 1800 buildings in all parts of the city. As funding is available more buildings will be so marked as unsafe. If an owner wishes to make the property safe he or she may apply for a permit to enter and make required repairs. If the building is brought up to minimum standards, the red X signage will be taken down.

FIREFIGHTER/EMT EXAMINATION ANNOUNCEMENT

Grade F1 - Examination #C8802-0001-2006

THE FIRST STEP in the Chicago Firefighter/EMT examination process is a written examination. Information regarding administration of the written examination will be available when applications are accepted. **NOTE:** Only a percentage of those applicants taking the written examination will be eligible to participate in additional steps of the hiring process.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

AGE: Applicants must have reached their 19th birthday by **May 31, 2006**. Proof of age **MUST** be provided at the time of application. **NOTE:** Pursuant to the Municipal Code of Chicago 2-152-410, an applicant above the age of 38 may not be appointed.

DRIVER'S LICENSE: Applicants **MUST** present a valid driver's license at the time of application.

EDUCATION: Applicants must have a minimum of a high school diploma or GED at the time of application.

RESIDENCY: Residency in the City of Chicago is required of all employees. Proof of residency will be required at the time of employment.

NOTE: Any person appointed to the position of Firefighter/EMT will be required to become EMT/B certified before graduation from the Fire Academy, and maintain said certification or be subject to dismissal from the service of the City of Chicago according to the rules.

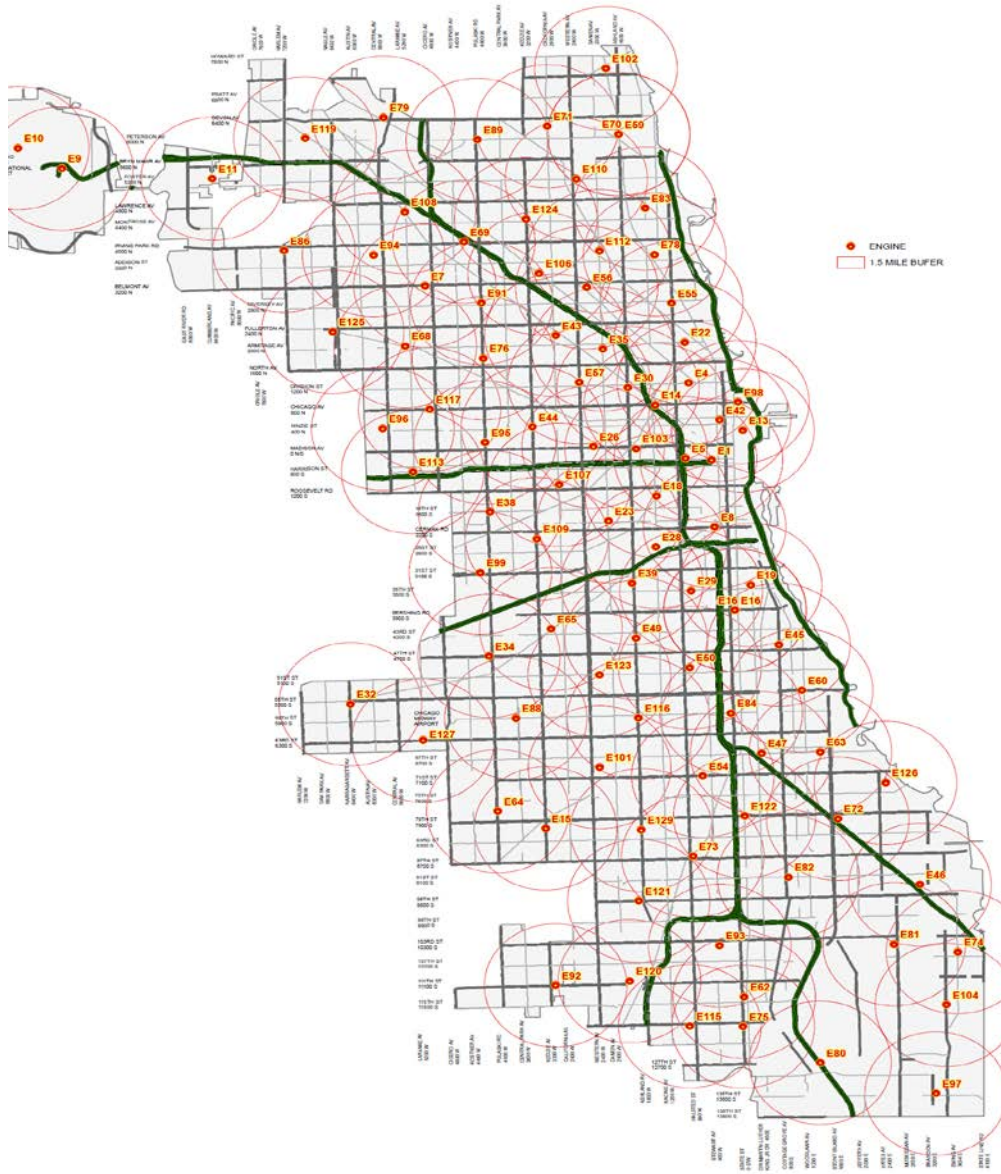

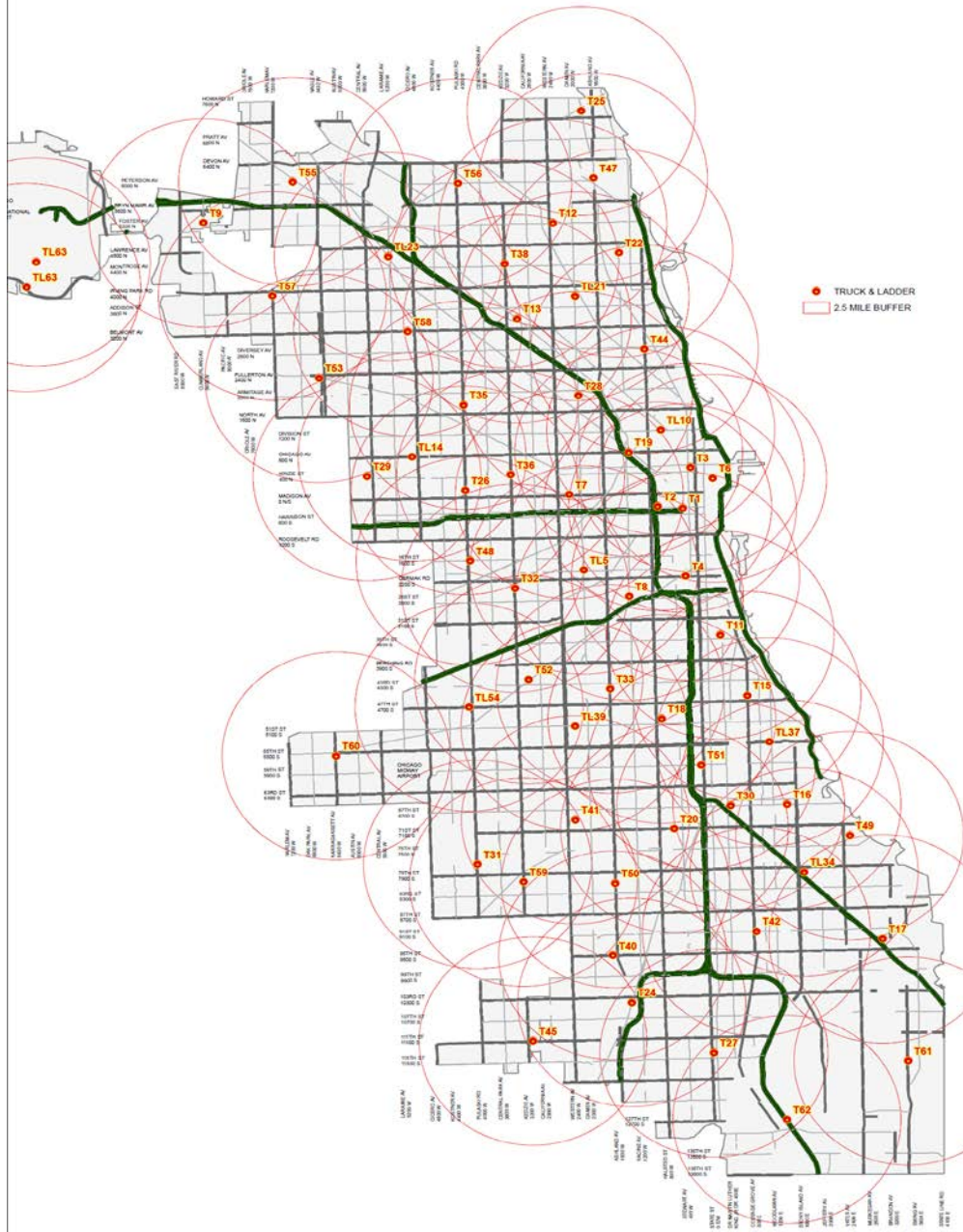

During our recent hearing to discuss the 2014 proposed budget, Alderman Cappleman requested information regarding the percentage of responses that a paramedic in Chicago performs CPR compared to Boston and New York.

In 2012, CFD responded to 294,934 calls for EMS service and performed CPR on 2,260 calls, or 0.76% of all calls. To date in 2013, CFD has responded to 304,837 calls and performed CPR on 2,036 calls, or 0.67% of all calls. While CFD was unable to get CPR data from Boston and New York, there is no indication that the CPR stats for CFD is out of the norm nationally.

Currently, CFD's Public Education Unit does not have any scheduled programs for 2014, with all life safety programming typically picking back up after the holiday season. However, the Public Education Unit averages approximately 10,000 programs per year that provides life safety instruction to over 350,000 people.
