The attached information is in response to questions posed at our department's hearing on November 1, 2017 to discuss the proposed 2018 budget.

Alderman Lopez requested information on the number of investigators populating the agency (or its predecessor) at the beginning of 2016, 2017 and 2018.

<u>IPRA</u>

As noted during our budget hearing, the Independent Police Review Authority (IPRA) experienced an unprecedented level of attrition during 2016 and 2017 as the City was contemplating the direction it was going to take with respect to the City's police accountability system. Thus, over the course of 2016 and 2017, IPRA saw a number of employees resign, retire or subject to layoff. Based on our internal records, IPRA's FTE count at the beginning of 2016 and 2017 is below:

As of September 15, 2017, IPRA ceased to exist as a department.

<u>COPA</u>

For the Civilian Office of Police Accountability, our FTE count was 0 at the beginning of 2017 as we were in the midst of hiring investigators for the agency. However, we have provided the current FTE investigative count for the agency by the date of employment below:

Chairman Austin requested that the agency confirm that the 2018 organizational chart and the number of vacancies reflected therein was correct.




*The City is currently conducting a search for the next Chief Administrator for the office (bringing the current total vacancy number for COPA to 25 for fiscal year 2017).


COPA Organization Overview




COPA Investigative Staff




COPA Investigative Staff Investigative Teams 1-6




COPA Investigative Staff Investigative Teams 7-12




